Frequently Asked Questions

How are the income tiers calculated?

Each tier is a multiple of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). So 300% FPL means the base FPL × 3, 400% is FPL × 4, and 500% is FPL × 5.

How is income calculated for households larger than 4?

Start with the 4-person limit and add the "each additional dependent" amount once per person beyond 4. A household of 5 at 300% FPL would be \$99,000 + \$17,040 = \$116,040. A household of 6 would be \$99,000 + \$17,040 + \$17,040 = \$133,080, and so on.
